## SACRAMENTS

**Infant Baptism and Marriage:** Because of the important community nature of the celebrations of Baptism and Marriage in the church, interested parties are expected to make advanced arrangements to allow time for appropriate preparation programs to be completed; for Baptism, preferably before the birth of the child or at least three months notice is required and for Marriage, at least six months notice is required.

**First Penance and First Communion:** Contact Chris Potter-Wroblewski in the church office at 323-2410 ext. 110 for requirements.

**Reconciliation:** The Sacrament of Penance (confession) is celebrated each Saturday from 3:30 – 5:00 in the church. In addition, the sacrament is available by appointment. Please call the church office to set up an appointment.

**Hospital Visits/Anointing of the Sick:** Please notify the Church office if you or a member of your family are hospitalized, or if the Sacrament of the Sick is needed. Due to HIPAA laws visitation by clergy/lay ministers may be denied unless you inform us .

We began in September and soon we will end our *Fulfill the Promise* Capital Campaign. With more than \$1.46 million in gifts and pledges earmarked for the effort, the campaign has been a huge success. I am grateful for the sacrifices, in many cases families made a second or third pledge to our building fund, that have been made. Once again I say, thank you to everyone who is on board.

Those who have yet to make a donation will have the chance to make a commitment next week during Mass when we recognize "Commitment Weekend." Each parish family in attendance will receive a pledge card and be asked to consider a pledge or donation. **A Family Advent Calendar**

A family Advent calendar helps people keep track of the days leading up to Christmas. It serves as a daily reminder that the birth of Jesus is the reason behind the season and helps family members pause for a few minutes each day to think about the importance of Jesus in their life and in the life of the world.

Advent calendars can be purchased in most card shops and religious bookstores. An even better approach, however, is to involve the whole family in making an Advent calendar of your own.

Using poster board and construction paper, magazine photos and whatever else strikes your fancy, create a picture of a family home, a neighborhood scene or a Christmas creche. Behind the doors, shutters and other possible hiding places in your picture (under a nest in the tree or rock in yard) draw or paste pictures or symbols that carry a special Advent message for your family. Tape construction paper shutters over the windows and doors so they can be opened easily to reveal your message. Make sure there is a message (and hiding place) for each of the days between the first Sunday of Advent and Christmas day. Put a Number over each hiding place, starting at the highest number, and working down gradually to your Christmas message.

Each message should help your family in their preparation for Christmas. Be creative in deciding what messages you will use in your Advent calendar. If possible, divide up the messages among family members so that ever day's message is a surprise for someone in the family. Messages can include:

† Simple scripture passages, e.g. 1 John 3:11 (This is the message taught from the beginning: We must love one another) or Matthew 5:14, 16 (You are the light of the world; your light must shine before others so they see the good things you do and praise your God in heaven).

† A family-enriching, Christmas preparation activities, like making dough ornaments together for the Christmas tree, deciding on a special gift you can buy as a family for a child from a poor family, or reading together a children's picture book on the birth of Jesus.

† A faith question to discuss together, e.g. why is Christmas so special, or what does Santa have to do with Jesus?

† A family, fun-time suggestion, e.g. sing the Fa La La song together, call grandma and tell her how much you love her, hug each other two or three times.

Put your advent calendar in a prominent place in your home. Choose a regular time during the day when you can all be together to uncover your message. Light a candle and say a simple prayer before your "grand opening."

A simple prayer like the following is appropriate for families with young children:

*Thank you, Jesus, for loving us. As we get ready to celebrate your birth on Christmas day, help us to share our love even more with each other.  
Amen*

### NOVEMBER PASTORAL COUNCIL NOTES

The Capital Campaign and the new church building were the major focal points at the November Pastoral Council meeting. Members learned of a "Mission Accomplished" Party on Saturday, December 11 to cheer achieving the first goal of the Capital Campaign--the Celebration Goal. That goal, \$1.4 million was met Nov. 10.

Dates for visits from the church liturgical consultant Fr. Mark Joseph Costello were also announced. These include December 3 for newcomers, December 4 with the New Church building committee members, and December 5 with the parish-wide advisory council. On the 23-24<sup>th</sup> weekend in January, Fr. Mark Joseph will speak at each Mass that weekend. He will meet with the New Church building committee the evening of January 23.

In other matters, Msgr. Shugrue asked members to familiarize themselves with the Diocese of Raleigh Pastoral Plan and the newly approved changes in the Eucharistic liturgy put forward by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops which will be put in place in Advent, 2011. Now in its planning and organizing stages, the plan will focus on faith formation and sacramental practice. Informational and input sessions will be held throughout the diocese in 2011. In Fayetteville, St. Patrick Church will host a session January 22.

Chairperson Sabrina Barr explained and expanded on the new organizational chart for council members. Council members are liaisons with parish ministry leaders to formulate annual goals and objectives for each group. These goals, objectives and successes are part of the annual parish plan required by the diocese each June.
