First Penance and First Communion: Contact Johnnie Winters in the church office at 323-2410 ext. 107 for requirements.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance (confession) is celebrated each Saturday from 3:30 – 5:00 in the church. In addition, the sacrament is available by appointment. Please call the church office to set up an appointment.

Hospital Visits/Anointing of the Sick: Please notify the Church office if you or a member of your family are hospitalized, or if the Sacrament of the Sick is needed. Due to HIPAA laws visitation by clergy/lay ministers may be denied unless you inform us .

World Day of the Sick

HEALING

Who may receive the Sacrament of Anointing?

Any baptized Catholic who is seriously ill due to sickness, injury, or old age may receive the Anointing of the Sick, even though there is no apparent danger of death. The sacrament should be received when the sick

person is best able to profit from it, and not be delayed until the person is at the point of death. Sick children, too, may receive this sacrament if they are old enough to be comforted by it, which is the age of reason. The elderly who are in a weakened condition are also encouraged by the Church to receive the Sacrament of Anointing, even though no dangerous illness is present. One should also receive it before a serious operation.
